 - Last night at 9:30pm, advised by FRD of a large trash pile on fire located at Covanta Fairfax
 - Units arrived to find a 50' x 50' household trash pile on fire, located outside of the facility and away from the building

IV. LEGISLATIVE UPDATES

- <u>U.S. Congressman Gerry Connolly</u> presented by Marlon Dubuisson
 - Congressman Connolly voted to pass the Protecting Our Kids Act that would:
 - Raise the purchasing age for semi-automatic weapons from 18 to 21 years old
 - Crack down on gun trafficking and straw purchases to get illegal guns off of our streets
 - Subject ghost gun purchases to background check requirements
 - Strengthen safe storage requirements to protect children from accidental shootings
 - Close the bump stock loophole to ban these deadly tools from civilian use
 - Outlaw high-capacity magazines, which are designed for mass killing and have been the accessory of choice in the bloodiest mass shootings



- Require an annual report of demographic data of those being determined to be ineligible to purchase guns
- Met with new Executive Director of LCAC, Rob Rutland-Brown to facilitate various Lorton community connections like Capital Area Food Bank, Workhouse Arts Center and School Board Member Karen Corbett Sanders

Highlights

- Tax Relief
 - o \$4B proposed in tax relief
 - Raises standard income tax deduction to \$8K for individuals and \$16K for joint filers
 - Rebates of \$250 for single filers and \$500 for joint filers
 - Eliminates state tax on groceries, menstrual products, phases in tax relief for eligible military retirees and refunds a portion of earned income tax credit

• Education

- Proposes pay increases for K-12 teachers and support staff by an average of 5% each.
- Provides \$1.25B for school construction, \$271.6M to hire more support staff and \$62.5M to increase number of reading specialists in elementary schools
- For higher education, includes an additional \$140M for financial aid for students at public universities and \$28.3M for Tuition Assistance Grants for students at private universities

• Health Care



- Proposes additional 600 development disability waivers
- Provides \$214.2M to increase reimbursement rates for combined personal care, dental, and home and community-based services
- Includes \$19.6M to improve state mental health facilities
- General Assembly will be meeting for a special session to consider the Governor's budget amendments on Friday
- o Redistricting
 - Member districts remain in place until the next election – so everyone keeps their current delegate and senator until then
