• Board Meeting today. Highlights include:

 - Sunday, March 27 from 1-4 pm at Grist Mill Park
- Flood Awareness
 - Ensure you're carrying flood insurance if needed
- Redistricting Advisory Committee
 - Report on name changes, not looking at name changes to the Mount Vernon or Mason district.
 - Changes to election precincts
 - Split Ft. Belvoir into 3 parts.
 Newington split along South Run and Stream Valley.

- Holland Hills Historical District Overlay approved
- Public Safety Incidents
 - 2/26 fire on Aspenpark Court tragically resulted in the first fire fatality of Mr. Charles Ngeh
 - 3/1 robbery at Antonelli's Pizza
 - Suspect entered and robbed an employee of their cell phone and cash register
 - Shots fired as employees fled. No one was hit
 - Investigation led to arrest and increased police presence has been assigned
- Meeting with Amazon executives next week to discuss Amazon Fresh at Lorton Marketplace and timing
- o Panera
 - Broke ground at Lorton Marketplace

 - Approved maximum tax rate at its current rate of \$1.14 per \$100 assessed value. Storck committed to reducing this for residents
 - Scheduled budget meetings will be broadcast on Channel 16

- Workhouse Master Plan
 - Held kickoff meeting
 - External community engagement strategies to come in the future
 - W13/W15 Future Groundbreaking
 - January 2022 contract award and construction commencing next week.
 - Request for Expressions of Interest for W13/W15 has been extending 4/22
- Lorton Fire Station
 - Building passed final inspection and the fire marshal pre-occupancy inspection was also approved
 - Once status is updated in FIDO, will request the Non-RUP
- \circ Central Green Bathrooms
 - Met with Jai Cole, new FCPA director to advocate for moving this along at a faster pace
- QUESTION: What type of uses are allowed in W13/W15?
 - Definitely restaurants and offices, but Nick will supply additional detail



- QUESTION: Will siding be completed on the Fire Station before occupancy?
 - Likely not due to supply chain delays. Contractor still has issues to remedy that do not impact occupancy.
- QUESTION: Lee District renaming. Is there any insight?
 - Supervisor Lusk held community meetings and they identified possibilities.
 - No specific recommendation has been provided to the Board.
- COMMENT: There was an equalization map a few years back that people could review for assessment rates. Would be great to have that again.
- COMMENT: It was shared with me that one of the reason the Central Green Bathroom's was delayed was due to a lawsuit on the design. I'm not aware of that, would be great to have clarity.
- QUESTION: Are there adequate resources to staff the new police station?
 - Yes, it's in this one and has been in this one. Issue isn't necessarily \$, but county-wide staffing shortages and recruitment.
 - It's been confirmed that if needed, all stations (including the new one) will be staffed at the same percentages rather than leaving just the new one under assigned
- COMMENT: 10% increase in valuations, with some areas over 20%. Storck will work on getting more communication out about calculations.



- QUESTION: I heard Alpine X can't develop because there is methane on the site?
 - To my knowledge, there is nothing that is impacting development of Fairfax Peak
 - There certainly is methane, but to my knowledge levels are manageable due to the existing capture systems
- QUESTION: You indicated an election precinct along South Run. Where can I find more information?

 - Each individual school's use of ESSER funds is now available on their website
- QUESTION: Any update on the County Superintendent search?
 - Yes, we've hired GR Recruitment and we will be reviewing all applications on the 17th
 - Interviews will occur at the end of March and the hiring process will also include a community panel that will consider candidates. Second interviews will occur in April and are hoping to hire by May for a start date July 1
- QUESTION: South County uses the gym at Newington Forest Elementary School. We've lost access because of electrical issues. Do you have any insight?



 I haven't heard of this, but if you follow-up by email I will look into it and see if we can find an alternative option for you.

• <u>Fairfax County Park Authority (FCPA) – Linwood</u> <u>Gorham</u>

- o Restrooms at Central Green
 - Still actively working to reduce completion timeline
- Playground at Central Green
 - Construction starting soon
- o Garden Plots
 - Absolute, clear path forward utilizing the Nike Site.
 - Should be for use for next year's growing season
- QUESTION: Will the garden plots have a name?
 - It doesn't yet. I will be backing a name that includes the word Nike for historical purposes. No official decision has been made.

IV. LEGISLATIVE UPDATES

- <u>U.S. Congressman Gerry Connolly</u> presented by Marlon Dubuisson
 - o Infrastructure Package



- Estimated the national capital region will receive \$18-20B in new infrastructure funding as a result of this bill over the next 5 years
- Rail \$66B will go to rail overall. Will fund CRX, Norfolk Southern Amtrak and VRE, as well as \$1.9B for the Long Bridge project.
- Federal funding for VRE will increase from \$30M to \$40M
- \$25B for airports, including \$15B for new construction benefiting Dulles & National
- EV Charging Stations \$7.5B to build stations across the country
- \$2.5B for electric and zero emission school buses
- \$106M for Virginia's EV charging network
- Reform Bill for Postal Service
 - Passed reform will increase reliability and transparency for on time mail delivery
 - Will also welcome retirees into Medicare, while saving the Postal Service \$22.6B over the next 10 years



- Free USPS from unnecessary requirements to prefund retiree health benefits
- More than 2,000 postal workers in 11th District
- House will vote on Omnibus funding tomorrow
- Congressman Connolly returned from Poland yesterday. Trip arranged to have ears on the ground and better understand the humanitarian needs required.

- <u>State Delegate Kathy Tran</u> presented by Benjamin Hermerding
 - Finalizing the State's budget for the next two years at \$13.4B
 - Notable Efforts
 - Recently passed a bill through the House of Delegates that reigns in predatory small business loans



- Also working to enact a local option to give property tax relief to surviving spouses that are not covered by the Virginia Constitution
- Follow-up: Town Hall for Transportation
 - Working through responses to a number of constituent concerns following the Town Hall
 - Church proposed (on Ox Road). They didn't have to conduct a preliminary traffic analysis, but based on the feedback both on the call and from the Delegate's office, they will perform a partial analysis.

v. COMMITTEE REPORTS

- <u>Transportation, Peter Weyland/Dale Rumberger Co-</u> <u>Chairs</u> presented by Peter Weyland
 - o Lorton Autotrain Backup



- Currently in discussions with Congressman Beyer's office to determine how to mitigate the spill over onto Lorton Rd.
- Alpine X Traffic Study
 - Hoping for more information on entrance options, signaling and signage soon
- Pohick Rd./Rt. 1 –Sidewalk
 - Requested a design study that would resolve the issue of the dirt path turning to mud.
 - Heard it was funded, but now hearing it's been diverted. Looking into this and will update
- Gunston Rd.
 - Will have more information on progress for the undergrounding of power poles at the next meeting
- Giles Run Bridge
 - Currently not being considered for funding as it's not yet in a condition which would prompt replacement. Delegate Tran's office is pushing on this.
 - Bridge is too low and leaves residents in the area without immediate access to emergency service vehicles in the event of a big rain
- Considering introducing no thru-truck traffic on Workhouse Rd.
- Section 3 Rt. 1 expansion project



- Has never been funded. Looking into what can be done.
- Lorton Rd. Turn Lane
 - Looking into what happened following the study of 2018.
- Fairfax County Parkway Telegraph Rd. to I-95
 - Traffic backs up quite often and some of that may take 10-20 minutes to get through. Keeping an eye on the backup to inform future discussions
- QUESTION: Pohick Rd. Sidewalk I saw a sign that was proposing a 10-ft sidewalk. Why would they adjoin a 4 ft sidewalk to a 10-ft sidewalk? Seems like an unnecessary expense.
 - Will inquire and see what I can find.
- QUESTION: Phase 3 Rt. 1 widening who authorizes the study and what office can we push to authorize and fund it?
 - It's almost entirely VDOT. I plan to make further inquiries and will report any findings.
 - Ben Hermerding will also inquire with VDOT.

• Land Use, Nick Firth



- o Lorton Warehouse Facility Resolution
 - 143,000 sq ft, not to exceed 175,000 sq ft. motor freight terminal to permit the use of a 'last mile delivery facility'
 - QUESTION: Are we going to have 1,000 trucks pulling in and out first thing in the morning/late at night, that will also impact the backup on the parkway? This use would create a lot of additional traffic.
 - These are larger minivans/transits. This is a 24 hr facility.
 - David Gill (on behalf of the applicant). This site has already been zoned and approved for 300,000 sq ft. and we have a site plan approved of 140,000 sq ft. The issue here is that staff determined that the use is a motor freight delivery rather than a warehouse, requiring an amendment. From that perspective, this is actually a downzoning. We are reducing the maximum sq ftg from 300,000 to 175,000. Deliveries largely happen overnight, thus they target non-peak hours for traffic.
 - QUESTION: Is this providing delivery to the general Lorton area, or to a larger area?
 - Correct. The larger regional facility is up near Baltimore.

- Resolution on Living Shorelines
 - Resolution is largely identical to the one passed by the Mount Vernon Council Citizens Association (MVCCA)
 - Offers a grandfather clause to those that have existing sea walls and improvements along the shoreline in response to Senate Bill 776

- o Overlook Ridge Park
 - Collaborating with County staff on questions and refinements related to the Zoning Interpretation



- A 300M + sq ft proposed data center in Prince William County lies at the headwaters of the Occoquan. Given we get our drinking water from Occoquan, the Environmental Committee is getting involved (as well as Fairfax County zoning).
 - More details to follow in coming meetings, including a drafted resolution on SCFs positions
- COMMENT: There was a stormwater issue at the USSR site and funding was allocated but never used. We're unaware of where it went. Can Supervisor Storck's office please check on where it was ultimately distributed and let us know?
