SCF approves Data Center Resolution, checklist

At our May Meeting, the Federation approved a resolution stating our hopes and expectations for the upcoming zoning amendments concerning future data center developments. We ask that all centers larger than 40,000 sq.ft. go through the Special Exception review, removing "by-right" allowances in I-4, I-5, and I-6 zones. Additionally, environmental factors must be held under strict scrutiny concerning energy and water usage, air quality, noise, and other impacts on the surrounding communities.
