Planning Comm. approves data center zoning

At their meeting that concluded on June 6th, the Fairfax County Planning Commission approved the staff-authored data center zoning amendments unanimously. The vote was held at the end of a two-day hearing with numerous residents speaking out. The Commission amended the original proposal, requiring a 500-foot setback for data center equipment, if it can't be enclosed, and extending the distance from Metro stations to one mile. The amendments now go to the Board of Supervisors on July 16th. For more

FCPS Teachers and Staff vote to unionize

After securing the right to collective bargaining in March 2023, the staff and teachers of Fairfax County schools voted to unionize just before the end of the school year. They have formed Fairfax Education Unions (FEU), combining the Fairfax County Federation of Teachers and the Fairfax Education Association. The organization represents over 27,500 FCPS employees and will negotiate contracts in search of "a livable wage," improved benefits, and working conditions.
