Data Center zoning vote delayed until September

The Fairfax County Board of Supervisors delayed their vote on zoning amendments for the approval of data centers throughout the County. A staff error with a previous two-week delay has pushed the decision to Sept. 10th with a new public hearing. The proposed changes will include the removal of "by-right" approvals and the use of Special Exception review for development in certain areas. The Federation approved a resolution recommending restrictions on impact to the environment and power consumption.
