### Supervisors approve new Data Center guidelines

The Board of Supervisors held a re-hearing on Sept 10<sup>th</sup> and passed updated zoning amendments for future data centers in Fairfax County. Larger facilities will now need to go through a special exception review for approval, and by-right rules are mostly removed. The Federation approved a resolution in favor of stricter regulation and now awaits the case-by-case basis of approving any such development in our area.

### **Overlook Ridge Park takes next step forward**

A recent site visit by the Federation Parks & Environ. Committee with reps from Waste Management and the Park Authority gave a look at the new park's progress. The park is being developed on the closed construction material landfill between I-95 and Furnace Road. A revised site plan was submitted in May and is expected to be approved soon, with review by the Department of Environmental Quality to follow. This would lead to construction starting in Spring 2025 and hopefully opening in Spring 2026.
